

The ICE BofAML BB-B US High Yield Constrained Index contains all securities in the ICE BofAML US High Yield Index rated BB+ through B- by S&P (or equivalent as rated by Moody's or Fitch), but caps issuer exposure at 2%. Index constituents are capitalization weighted, based on their current amount outstanding, provided the total allocation to an individual issuer does not exceed 2%. A Credit Default Swap Index is a credit derivative used to hedge credit risk or to take a position on a basket of credit entities. The indices do not reflect the payment of transaction costs, fees and expenses associated with an investment in the Fund. It is not possible to invest directly in an index. The Fund's returns may not correlate with the returns of their benchmark indices.

Credit Quality weights by rating were derived from the highest bond rating as determined by S&P, Moody's or Fitch. Bond ratings are grades given to bonds that indicate their credit quality as determined by private independent rating services such as Standard & Poor's, Moody's and Fitch. These firms evaluate a bond issuer's financial strength, or its ability to pay a bond's principal and interest in a timely fashion. Ratings are expressed as letters ranging from 'AAA', which is the highest grade, to 'D', which is the lowest grade. In limited situations when none of the three rating agencies have issued a formal rating, the Advisor will classify the security as nonrated. Credit default swaps use bond-equivalent prices to calculate portfolio weights and % of portfolio would be negative if short the index. Investment Grade includes credits that are BBB- or above. Returns shown for A Shares and C Shares without sales charge do not reflect the maximum sales load of 3.75% or the Contingent Deferred Sales Charge (CDSC) of 1.00% for the first year; if reflected, performance would be lower than shown. Returns for A and C Shares reflect the deduction of the current maximum initial sales charges of 3.75% and 1.00% CDSC. C Shares convert automatically to A Shares approximately eight years after purchase. A Shares are subject to lower annual expenses than C Shares. I Shares sold to a limited group of investors. Current Yield is that of the securities held in the portfolio; it is not reflective of the yield distributed to shareholders. Current yield is calculated by taking the annual income (interest or dividends) divided by the current price of the security. Yield-to-Worst is the lowest possible yield from owning a bond considering all potential call dates prior to maturity. Modified Duration measures the price sensitivity of a bond to interest rate movements. Spread over Treasuries is the yield-to-worst of the portfolio minus the yield-to-worst on Treasuries. Average Coupon Rate is the weighted average of the interest rate stated on a bond, expressed as a percentage of the principal (face value). The 30-day SEC Yield represents net investment income earned by a fund over a 30-day period, expressed as an annual percentage rate based on the fund's share price at the end of the 30-day period. The SEC Yield should be regarded as an estimate of the fund's rate of investment income, and it may not equal the fund's actual income distribution rate, the income paid to a shareholder's account, or the income reported in the fund's financial statements.
